- **Agenda Item #1:**

- **Presentation:** *I-25 Improved Project: Comanche to Montgomery Active Transportation Maps* — Luke Smith, Central Region Design, New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) & Mike Worrall, Program Manager, Horrocks
 - NMDOT and the consultant team provided an update related to bicycle and pedestrian connectivity within this project. Based on community and GAATC input, the project team was able to make adjustments to the design builder's contract to accommodate design changes. The changes included converting the on-street bikeway to a full off-street combined bicycle and pedestrian shared-use path through the length of the project. The presenters walked through a presentation with graphics showing the project and changes.

- **Presentation:** *Esperanza Bicycle Safety Education Center Facilities and Programs* — Eli Kosko, Bicycle Education Coordinator, CABQ Parks & Recreation Department
 - Eli provided a presentation about the Esperanza Bicycle Safety Education Center, covering:
 - What is Esperanza? A non-retail, free bike shop offering parts and services, education, and resources. Housed within the City of Albuquerque's Parks and Recreation Department.
 - Program Offerings: earn-a-bike, bike repair clinic, pop-up clinics, and bike safe educational programming
 - Partners, including Family and Community Services Department, Department of Municipal Development, APS, Kidical Mass, Albuquerque Museum, Public Libraries, APS, Explora, Free Bikes 4 Kids, Safe Routes to Schools Partnership, among others.

 - CABQ Department of Municipal Development
 - Welcome to new GAATC members Scott and Joseph, and thank you for your patience throughout the appointment process.
 - Thanks to Chair Applegate and Vice-Chair Roça for serving in these roles for the last year. Each January, GAATC members will vote for a new Chair and Vice Chair. The Chair is responsible for following the agenda and running the meetings. The Chair is also the primary liaison between the committee and City staff. If the Chair is not able to make it to a meeting, then the Vice Chair will be responsible for managing the meeting. City staff have put together a cheat sheet to assist in running meetings and are always available to answer any questions. Please note this will be on GAATC's January agenda, so please think about whether you might want to participate in one of these roles.
 - CABQ Parks and Recreation Department
 - Eli also forgot to share in the presentation that if anyone would like to learn about bike safety, they can also audit the class that takes place every Monday. You can email Esperanza to give them a heads up and let them know you're interested in learning.
 - CABQ Department of Senior Affairs
 - Last Thursday, their staff planned a field trip out of the North Valley with 20 older adults using free transportation that did not involve private automobiles. They used micro transit, electric vans, and ART. Unfortunately, with the 2-hour snow delay, the field trip was a bit truncated, but people still enjoyed the conversation and learning how to use free transit. It was their staff's first attempt to help older adults start thinking about how to use public transportation differently.
 - CABQ Planning Department
 - Sections 1-3 of the Near North Valley and North I-25 Community Planning Area (CPA) assessment report(s) will be posted by the end of December 2025. These reports also provide links to a Miro board with comments received from the general public about elements such as Transportation (including biking, walking, and transit).

 - Bernalillo County's Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Plan was approved by the Bernalillo County Planning Commission, and it goes to the full Commission in January for approval.

- Bike Safe – Educational Programming


Earn – A – Bike

- Participant learns how to and performs the work on their own bike with the help of our assistant and lead mechanics
- All parts are donated by the community

- Doesn't require an appointment
- Slightly more limited resources and repair options but greater opportunities for outreach




