### **Project Updates from Bernalillo County Public Works**

**Pedestrian & Bicyclist Safety Action Plan Update Final Draft** – will be presenting to County Planning Commission in August.

Alameda Drain Trail phase 4 (El Pueblo to Alameda Blvd) – under construction

Alameda Drain Trail phase 6 – (Alameda Blvd to 4<sup>th</sup> St NW) cancelled due to lack of connectivity. Pueblo of Sandia did not want the trail to enter their land; NMDOT rejected all of the county's alternatives to provide connectivity.

**4<sup>th</sup> St NW Road Diet** - (Ortega Rd to Alameda Blvd) completing design. Need additional funding for HAWK signal at Ortega Rd.

Bridge Blvd phase 2 - completed with buffered bike lanes and wider sidewalks

**Bridge Blvd phase 3** – 30% design; will be finalizing design over coming year; no construction funding; have applied for RAISE and CMAQ; applying for **SS4A implementation grant** due at the end of June.

**Blake Rd phase 2** – (Isleta Drain Trail to Foothills Rd) construction this fall with bike lanes, sidewalks, and traffic calming.

**Sunset Rd phases 2/3** – (Bridge Blvd to Gonzales Rd) right-of-way maps and final design will include sidewalks and sharrow.

**Isleta Blvd phase 1** – (Malpais Rd to Luchetti Rd) construction late this year with sidewalks and buffered bike lanes.

**Coors Blvd Pedestrian Safety** – (Gun Club Rd to Blake Rd) 30% design with multi-use tails on both sides; two midblock crossings with HAWK signals.

Frost Rd Trai phase 2 – (Candy Ct to Vallecitos Rd) construction later this year.

**TPF Grant** – applying for **2<sup>nd</sup> St NW phase 1** (4<sup>th</sup> St NW to Sheriff Posse Tr) includes protected bike lanes and sidewalks and would've provided necessary connectivity for Alameda Drain Trail.
